FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

IF I APPLY FOR 12 SCHOLARSHIPS DO I NEED TO MAKE 12 COPIES OF MY APPLICATION?

No. One complete application packet with essays and letters of recommendation is to be turned in to the Smith-Cotton High School counselor's office. Copies will be made for you.

DO I NEED TO WRITE ESSAYS FOR THE SCHOLARSHIPS THAT REQUIRE THEM <u>AND</u> THE GENERAL ESSAY "WHY I SHOULD BE CHOSEN FOR THIS SCHOLARSHIP"?

Yes, any specific essay needs to be included with your application as well as the general essay.

I HAVE APPLIED FOR OTHER SCHOLARSHIPS AND/OR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE, BUT I DON'T KNOW IF I HAVE RECEIVED IT YET. WHAT DO I PUT ON MY APPLICATION FOR "List other financial assistance you will receive per semester or quarter?"

Write down what you know. (For example; Bright Flight or Athletic Scholarship Award.) You may also want to comment on other awards you have applied for or expect to receive (for example; Pell Funding.)

HELPFUL TIPS

- READ THROUGH THE ENTIRE SCHOLARSHIP PACKET.
- CHECK MARK ALL THE SCHOLARSHIPS FOR WHICH YOU QUALIFY.
 - O LOOK FOR A MATCH WITH YOUR MAJOR OR AREA OF STUDY IN COLLEGE.
 - O MATCH THE ACTIVIES YOU WERE INVOLVED IN DURING HIGH SCHOOL--BOTH AT SMITH-COTTON OR WHITTIER AND IN THE COMMUNITY—WITH SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA.
- ASK FOR LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. YOU MAY RECEIVE A BETTER LETTER
 OF RECOMMENDATION FROM SOMEONE WHO DOES NOT HAVE TO RUSH THROUGH IT.
- **PAY ATTENTION** TO WHAT THE SCHOLARSHIP IS ASKING FOR. IF THE CRITERION FOR A SCHOLARSHIP IS FINANCIAL NEED, BE SURE TO ADDRESS THAT IN YOUR ESSAY.

Thank you for your interest in scholarship opportunities that are managed by the Sedalia School District Foundation. Thanks to the generosity and foresight of many thoughtful individuals and families, over \$64,000 in scholarships is available for graduates of Smith-Cotton and Whittier High Schools.

Students applying for a Foundation Scholarship must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Graduate from Smith-Cotton or Whittier High School in December 2020 or May 2021.
- 2. Use your Sedalia School District lunch pin number to identify yourself on the scholarship application. Contact the counselor's office if you do not know your lunch pin.
- 3. Provide two letters of recommendation.
 - a. One recommendation letter should be from school personnel and one from outside the school district.
 - b. Letters should be generic in nature while the recommendation itself should be specific regarding your attitude, academic ability, college potential, and personal attributes. Please provide your student lunch pin to use in your identification for those writing letters of recommendation.
 - c. Please note: Several scholarships have specific requirements on letters of recommendation.
- **4. Attach a written essay** on **"Why I should be chosen for this scholarship."** (Along with any specific essay required to apply for certain scholarships.)
 - a. Essays should be legible and grammatically correct. Please use your Student lunch pin and not your name when identifying yourself on essay.
 - b. You may wish to explain extenuating circumstances which might be important in determining your eligibility.
- 5. Please attach a list of your leadership qualifications and the extra-curricular activities you were involved in during high school. You may wish to attach a resume. Please use your Student lunch pin and not your name when identifying yourself on list or resume.
- 6. Have a significant classroom teacher complete the "**Teacher Recommendation**" form <u>as required</u>. Please provide your student lunch pin to teacher completing the Teacher Recommendation form.
- 7. Foundation scholarship recipients **must write a thank you note** to the appropriate Foundation Scholarship Donor by July 1, 2021. Scholarship recipients will receive the name and address of donor when the scholarship is awarded at Senior Awards Night on May 5, 2021.
- 8. Submit the completed application and all accompanying documents to Smith-Cotton High School Counselor's office or craftonp@sedalia200.org by **4:00 pm February 10, 2021.**
